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ACC Honors Program

The Alvin Community College Honors Program provides students unique intellectual opportunities to challenge themselves and enhance their ability to succeed at higher levels academically. The Honors Program allows students a flexible, collaborative setting where they enjoy a vibrant and stimulating classroom experience. Honors designation demonstrates to universities that you are a serious student and deserve due consideration for admission to the university. It can also enhance your ability to get scholarships that will help defray the increasing costs of higher education.

Who is eligible?

Students wanting to participate in Honors classes or create an Honors project in a regular class must meet **at least one** of the following:

- A GPA of at least 3.25 with at least 12 hours
- An ACT score of at least 26
- An SAT score of at least 1100
- Graduation in the top 20% of your high school class
- Approval by the class instructor

How does it work?

Students are encouraged to develop independent projects with ACC faculty members or departmental mentors and are exposed to the interactive, critical environment that will define their future careers. The ACC Honors Program offers two opportunities for Honors credit.

- Honors course sections with smaller class size
- Regular course sections with Honors projects

What are the benefits?

Honors students have access to:

- Participation in local, regional, and national conferences
- Scholarships
- Honors designation on transcripts
- Opportunity to earn honors graduation distinctions
- Recognition at ACC's Awards Day ceremony
- Energetic and committed faculty
