### ALVIN COMMUNITY COLLEGE MAINTENANCE & OPERATIONS BUDGET ACADEMIC YEAR 2020-2021

Office of the President Dr. Christal M. Albrecht September 2020

The College began the development of the proposed 2020-2021 budget in Fall 2019 with an all campus meeting to discuss budget assumptions followed by a meeting with the Planning and Assessment Council (PAC). The PAC is a broad-based membership council and serves as the principal resource allocation and planning and assessment organization for ACC's institutional effectiveness efforts. Under the leadership of the President and assisted by the Co-chairs of the PAC (Executive Director of Institutional Effectiveness and the Vice President of Administrative Services), the PAC provides the leadership for ACC's institutional effectiveness system including strategic planning. In so doing, the Council ensures that ACC's mission statement reflects our College's values, purpose and direction so that ACC may better serve its students and communities. The strategic planning system also addresses ACC's performance in an accountable way so it may demonstrate the College's commitment and success in providing quality programs for our students.

Initial budget requests were due to the Executive Leadership Team (ELT) at the end of March, 2020. On March 5, just before the College's spring break and subsequent 2-week closure of the College due to the COVID-19 pandemic, budget presentations were held wherein requests for new personnel, equipment and any items related to the 2016-2021 Strategic Plan were presented to the Planning and Assessment Council (PAC) by various college departments. During the presentations to the PAC, employees from across the college proposed their budget requests with justification for needs. Each presentation was scored based on a 25-point rubric with criteria including Health and Safety, Accreditation, Immediacy, Level of Impact and ACC's Operating Plans and Breakthrough Strategic Goals. Scores were tallied and subsequently ranked from highest score to lowest.

By mid-May, 2020, the rankings were presented to the ELT for discussion and consideration. There were 17 new positions requested, no new equipment requested and a software purchase requested by Student Services to help implement the Quality Enhancement Plan (QEP). The ELT determined that due to the pandemic and probable loss in revenues and increase in expenses, that no new positions should be added to the 2020-2021 budget, beyond those already approved by the Board in February 2020 in support of the implementation of the QEP.

Initial budget discussions with the Board occurred at the June 15, 2020 Budget Workshop. The budget was subsequently discussed at the June 25, 2020 Board meeting and at the July 13, 2020 Budget workshop, the July 23, 2020 Board meeting and the August 3, 2020 Board workshop. The Board approved the budget during the August 13, 2020 meeting, proposed a tax rate of 0.183443, which is a tax increase of 8.31% above the effective tax rate, and adopted that tax rate during the September 17, 2020 meeting, after holding the required tax hearing on September 17, 2020.

Included in the \$36,685,421 budget is the move to the new compensation plan to bring underpaid employees up to the minimum of their salary and a 2% increase at a combined cost of \$484,971 and the purchase of the Student Services software. The last vacant Court Reporting faculty position was allocated to a 10.5-month Logistics faculty position. An additional \$1,334,172 was directed to the institutional reserve.

#### Summary of the 2019-2020 Academic Year

The 2019-2020 academic year has been a very busy year, full of challenges and accomplishments. along with many activities associated with the passage of the Maintenance Tax Note and preparation for the decennial Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC) site visit. In July, the College was notified that the site visit would be a virtual one and that likely the reaccreditation will be delayed a year. The second half of the year was consumed by activities surrounding the COVID-19 Pandemic. In a matter of two weeks, the college moved all courses, wherever possible, to an online format. Remote, virtual advising, counseling, financial aid counseling, tutoring and more student services also moved to an online format. It was a huge challenge for students, staff and faculty but it had to be done. ACC is remarkably proud of the students who had to adapt to the changes, as well as the faculty who had to learn a new online learning platform that some had never used before and staff had to adapt to working remotely. The physical plant, custodians, police and others kept the campus clean and safe during the two-week period of college closure and the subsequent period of altered operations. which currently remain in effect. In late May, students from the spring semester who were not able to complete their courses returned to campus in small groups, observing social distancing and finished their hands-on training to allow completion of courses, certificates and degrees. Summer courses were all offered online. For the Fall 2020 semester, approximately 5% of courses will be delivered as face-to-face; there will be about 12% of courses offered in a hybrid format for those courses that have a hands-on component; and the remaining courses will be offered totally online, mostly in a synchronous format.

Over the last year, Alvin Community College achieved many successes. Here are a few of the highlights:

#### General Highlights of the Year:

- After two years of recovering from Hurricane Harvey, Fall 2019 enrollment was at an all-time high in the 71-year history of the college with 5,993 students registered.
- The College submitted the decennial compliance report to SACSCOC on February 18, 2020. An executive summary of ACC's Quality Enhancement Plan (QEP) entitled Success through Engaged Advising (SEA) was also submitted at the same time. We received feedback on the decennial report on May 29 and discussed the report with our SACSCOC Vice President, Dr. Glover on June 2. She plans to either personally or virtually visit the campus in early July. Now that we have received feedback, we will have an opportunity to make additions or corrections and submit our Focused Report in August, along with the Quality Enhancement Plan (QEP). The college's site visit is still scheduled for October 12-15, 2020, although it may be partly virtual and partly on-site.

- The ACC Community Advisory Committee, originally convened in September 2014, continues to meet three times a year to discuss issues facing the college. The committee is made of business leaders, taxpayers, elected officials, community members and educators. Recent activity included the Advisory Committee's assistance with the development of ACC's Core Values statements ACC C.A.R.E.S.
- The Dual Degree program continues to be popular with our area high schools. On Friday, May 22, 2020, the college held a virtual graduation ceremony for 181 dual degree graduates. These students received their Associate Degree two weeks before receiving their high school diplomas. Also in the same ceremony, 46 students received a college certificate. The college also held its first virtual graduation ceremony on Saturday May 23 for the other 227 graduates.
- Over the past 5 years (2014-15 to 2018-19), Student Persistence (Fall to Spring) has increased from 70% to 75% and Student Retention (Fall to Fall) has increased from 42% to 44%. The number of certificates awarded increased from 297 to 433, a 46% increase, and the number of all degrees awarded has increased by 10%, from 1,128 to 1,240.
- Over the past four years, ACC has reduced the time to complete a degree from 4.2 years to 3.3 years. In the same four years, ACC reduced the average semester credit hour to Associate Degree from 88 SCH to 72 SCH, representing savings of time and money for our students.

- Hundreds of community members filled the campus grounds on October 26<sup>th</sup> for the annual ACC Fall Festival.
- Faculty and staff members celebrated 71 years of ACC during a Founder's Day gathering on November 15, 2019 in the Student Center.
- Approximately 1,300 people were treated to breakfast and approximately 450 families were nominated to receive donated food and toys during the annual Breakfast with Santa.
- ABC Channel 13 visited ACC to watch firearms training and high speed pursuit training at our Law Enforcement Academy. The segment aired in January.
- Alvin Community College posted excellent pass rates on state, national and professional organization certification/licensure exams. For the 2018-19 year, the percentage of students passing the exam is as follows:

- The Foundation issued more than \$200,000 in scholarships, staff development, emergency stipends and more. The Foundation awarded \$85,000 in scholarships to students at area high schools and \$40,000 to ACC students this year. Once again, the Gala set a new fund raising record, surpassing last year's record. The Foundation revamped the Employee Giving Campaign, Kind is the New Cool, and saw an increase of 117% in participation.
- In January 2018, ACC, in cooperation with the Houston Food Bank, opened an extension Food Bank on campus to serve student who receive Pell grants with an Estimated Family Contribution of \$0. Students may shop in the Food Bank two times a month and obtain 120 pounds of food including meat, fruits, vegetables and dry goods. In Fall 2019, 56 students participated in the Food Bank at least one time with some making over three visits. Of the 23 participants visiting the market three or more times during the fall term, 91% completed their degree or persisted to the spring semester and had an average 3.062 GPA. This compares to 35 students visiting the market three or more times in the fall of 2018, 85% completed their degree or persisted to the spring semester and had a 3.054 GPA.
- The college hosted the 4<sup>th</sup> annual Across the Curriculum Conference in February 2020. The Conference provides local educators with an opportunity to share their teaching methods while also learning from each other.
- Many events had to be canceled due to the COVID-19 Pandemic including Empty Bowls, the Amazing Race to College, Awards Day, An Afternoon of Honor, Nursing Pinnings, and more. Creation of virtual celebrations helped ease the sting of not being able to celebrate in person.
- The Baseball and Softball teams were disappointed when their season was cut short in March.
   But they are excited to have a new leased bus to take future trips to play against their favorite rival teams.
- ACC received \$344,783 in grant funds in support of community education efforts such as the Department of Education Upward Bound grant.
- Instructional and support service grants totaling \$3,289,529 were received including a \$138,840 Perkins grant.
- We continue to advance in our work in the Texas Pathways program, after the college advanced to Cadre 1 last year. The Pathways work helped inspire our choice of our QEP topic, Success through Engaged Advising (SEA).

#### Faculty, Staff, and Program Awards and Recognitions

- Since joining our staff as the Head Librarian, Becky McClain has implemented many changes and innovations to make the library a more effective learning space for our students and the community. She was awarded a \$24,870 grant from the Tocker Foundation in order to help digitally scan more than 100 years of the Alvin Sun archives.
- Overhauling the college website is a massive undertaking requiring development and cooperation with staff members throughout the campus. In the Fall of 2019, our Marketing Team unveiled the new website and had a successful launch. The project was approximately two years in development and included the work of many of our staff members, including

Marketing Director Lorrent Smith, Web Administrator Charzetta Fleming and Web Designer Dacia Henderson.

- The ACC Faculty Senate is an organization that represents our instructors and facilitates
  effective communication between our faculty and administration. The 2019-20 officers are
  President Dr. Esther Kempen, Chemistry Faculty, Vice President Dr. Mary Jove, Business
  Management Faculty, Secretary Tommy Dan Morgan, Biology Faculty and Treasurer Heather
  Lewis, Biology Faculty.
- Student Retention Director Holly Williams and Retention student worker Janisha Stewart, who
  operate the ACC Food Bank, were recognized for their efforts with our on-campus extension
  of the Houston Food Band and were presented with the Higher Education Partnership Award.
- Sergeant Charlie Lootens was named a Hometown Hero in recognition of her service to the college and the community. She was honored at halftime during the Shadow Creek-Friendswood game.
- Media Technology specialist Kyle Marasckin and Theatre Design coordinator D'Carrey Stell.
  were recognized for their efforts in operating the college float and driving it in the homecoming
  parades for Shadow Creek, Manvel and Alvin High School. ACC won Best Float in the Manvel
  High School parade.
- Haley Collins, English Faculty and Dr. Mekonnen Birru, Nursing Faculty, were honored at the annual League for Innovations Conference in March in Seattle. The annual award honors faculty for outstanding contributions and leadership among our nation's Community Colleges.
- Nursing Faculty Wendy Stewart and Courtney Wolfe completed a research project which
  detailed how the department adjusted the curriculum to ensure that students are receiving more
  training in performing pediatric exams. The project placed third among 45 entrants in a national
  competition sponsored by the Organization for Associate Degree Nursing (OADN).
- Continuing Education Director of Health Programs Leigh Davis and Director of Business and Technology Sara Currie completed the Chair Academy. The Academy helps educational leaders understand their personal style of leadership while also bringing out the best of others. The two-year program included personal assessments, two week-long training sessions, a practicum and more.
- ACC English Lead Faculty member Leigh Ann More was awarded the Susan Faulkner Excellence in Teaching Award from the Two-Year College English Association. The TYCA is a six-state organization that provides teachers and administrators of junior college English with professional development opportunities and a platform to discuss issues facing educators. during the organization's regional conference.
- Events Coordinator Robin Dahms and Jeff Parks, Dean of Professional, Technical and Human Performance programs were recognized for hosting a delegation of 11 educators from China on campus to learn about the many different programs offered at ACC. The visit is part of a program to help the Nanjing teachers learn more about education in the community, the culture of education in schools and how instruction is implemented in the region. The instructors toured several programs including Dental Assisting, Respiratory Care, Criminal Justice and Process Technology.

- Grants Coordinator Mr. Gayland Capps accepted the Partnership Award for Community College Engagement from the Texas Workforce Commission during the commission's annual conference. The honor recognizes ACC's work with local employers to help meet the demands of a global economy and aligning workers' skills with workforce needs. Over the past several years, Capps has worked with TWC on several grants to benefit ACC students. Since Gayland started with ACC in 2011, he has helped generate more than \$11 million in grant funds from TWC and \$18 million in grant funds overall.
- Vice President of Financial Services Karl Stager, Director of Fiscal Affairs Deborah Kraft, Assistant Director of Fiscal Affairs Laurel Joseph and Fiscal Affairs Grants Accountant Genesis Barrios were recognized for helping those in need of assistance with filing their taxes through the annual Volunteer Income Tax Assistance Program sponsored by the Brazoria County United Way.
- The Southwestern Educational Research Association recently honored graduate students in the region for their exceptional research. The organization recognized our College and Career Pathways Director Akilah Martin who is researching African American student participation in Dual Enrollment programs. She is a student at the University of Houston Clear Lake pursuing her doctorate in educational leadership with an emphasis on higher education.
- In March, Dr. Albrecht was awarded the Phi Theta Kappa Texas Hall of Fame Honor for the Texas Region. In April, she was chosen as one of 13 Presidents nationally to receive the Phi Theta Kappa Shirley B. Gordon Award of Distinction for her support of the Mu Upsilon Chapter of Phi Theta Kappa at Alvin Community College.

#### **Student Awards and Recognitions**

- The Community College Aerospace Scholar program is an educational experience for students interested in a career in science, technology, engineering and mathematics. ACC student Keaton Jones was chosen for the prestigious program. He received a four-day, in-person experience at a NASA center and a five-week online workshop which included live video chats with NASA experts. He enjoyed his onsite experience at NASA Wallops Flight Facility in Wallops Island, VA.
- Student Government Association President Lorna Craft, Vice President Cherlyn Crawford and Secretary Macey Parks were recognized for their election as officers for the 2019-20 year and for their service in attending ACC Board of Regents meetings and providing periodic reports.
- ACC Art student Hannah Bates hand-painted an ornament that was selected by State Rep. Ed
  Thompson to represent District 29 on the Capitol Tree. Every holiday season, the Texas Capitol
  puts up a Christmas Tree decorated with ornaments produced by artists throughout the state.
- As concerns about mental health in this country continue to grow, the ACC Active Minds
  Chapter is attempting to help raise awareness about this issue. Student volunteers hosted a shoe
  drive on campus. Several boxes of shoes were donated and were used as part of an exhibit to
  demonstrate the number of people impacted by suicide, mental illness and drug and alcohol
  abuse. The shoes were then donated to local charities. Active Minds President Alex Hunt, Vice
  President Chiara Lange and Secretary Marie Resendez were recognized for their work.

• Upward Bound Advisor Sharmeal Archie, Speech Faculty Dr. Earnest Burnett and Dr. Maria Starling, Student Activities Coordinator Querencia Joshua, former Dual Enrollment Advisor Gwendolyn Burgess and members of the Black Student Association including Khalifa Elaziz Hudspeth, Eberechi Estina Onye-Franklin, Adebola Victoria Adebambo and Derek Joseph Marks Jr. were recognized for their work with the ACC Black Student Association. The Association and Student Activities held several events in recognition of Black History Month.

During the 2019-2020 year, members of the Planning and Assessment Council participated in the budget planning process to develop the 2019-2020 budget. Dr. Pam Shefman chaired the Council, Mr. Karl Stager provided administrative support and members included: Leigh Davis, Debra Fontenot, Jennifer Hopkins, Deborah Kraft, Juanita Marasckin, Carolyn McCollum, Leigh Ann Moore, Anna Oskerson, Pat Sanger, Jaime Ward, Holly Williams, Stacy Ebert, Cynthia Griffith, John Matula, Marby McKinney, Nadia Nazarenko, Dwight Rhodes, Kelly Klimpt, Jeff Parks, Esther Kempen and Jeanine Wilburn. This inclusive planning process also includes the review of student and program learning outcomes for all programs and services offered at Alvin Community College.

#### **STATE NEWS**

The 2020-2021 proposed Maintenance and Operations Budget for Alvin Community College does not have a proposed reduction in the State Appropriation due to statements Governor Abbott made in a letter to community colleges and state agencies dated May 20, 2020, ie. "Given the importance of the state's response to COVID-19 and the continuity of critical government functions, the following are excluded from the five percent reduction:

Appropriations to Health Related Institutions and Community College;"

Health Insurance and Dental Insurance premiums did not increase for 2020-2021. Community Colleges avoided the cap on the tax rollback rate in the 2019 Legislative session and therefore kept the 8% rollback rate capability that they have had historically.

#### **LOCAL NEWS**

The Fall 2019 enrollment for the College was an all-time high of 5,593 students with corresponding uncertified contact hours of 912,384. The 2020-2021 tuition and fee estimate is currently based on current year 2019-2020 actual tuition and fee revenue increased by 2.18% and then reduced by 10%. The College's full-time Instructional and Administrative employee count in the proposed Maintenance and Operations Budget for Fiscal Year 2020-2021 is 287 compared to 283 at the beginning of fiscal year 2019-2020. The Board of Regents added four positions in 2019-2020 in the Student Support services area. A Cyber Security Program will be developed and implemented in Spring 2021 and a Logistics program will be developed in the near future. Historically during recessions, community colleges see an increase in student headcount and contact hours. The current tuition and fee estimate for 2020-2021 does not yet reflect that increase due to a perceived delay of students returning to campus because of the suppressing effects of the COVID-19 pandemic. It will be very important for Alvin Community College to stay fully staffed during this pandemic to prepare for this future increase in students.

The Certification of 2020 Estimated Value from the April 2020 Appraisal Roll from the Brazoria County Appraisal District shows that the Net Taxable Value has increased to \$12,672,687,742 compared to \$11,263,683,753 in July 2019, which is a 12.5% increase. This translates into an \$2,284,186 increase in tax revenue.

#### **CAMPUS AREA NEWS**

The economy of the local area shows the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic. The College Fall 2020 enrollment is down 6.1% in headcount and 11.8% in contact hours compared to 2019. The news

below shows that ACC graduates have a job market that they are entering that still has uncertainty due to the pandemic but has made some gains since the low point that occurred this past spring.

#### Houston Economic Indicators

September 4, 2020

Indicators for Houston employment, unemployment and manufacturing improved in July. Leading and coincident indexes also showed gains. Higher-frequency data on mobility and engagement point to a tepid end-of-summer recovery from a COVID-19-driven midsummer lull. Taken together, the data suggest that Houston continues to make strides toward economic recovery, but the pace has likely slowed.

#### **Business-Cycle and Leading Indexes**

The Houston Business-Cycle Index surged 17.1 percent over the three months ending in July as pandemic-induced restrictions on the local economy were relaxed (Chart 1). The improvement was driven by sharp increases in payroll numbers and positive unemployment data.

An index of 10 leading indicators for Houston climbed 6.5 percent over the three months ending in July. The improvement was broad based over that time except for the U.S. rig count and new equipment orders for manufacturing. While indicative of economic and job growth ahead, the index cannot account for how changes in COVID-19 cases, hospitalizations and containment policies will affect economic outcomes. New daily cases and hospitalizations are trending down in Houston, but it would undermine the positive local outlook if the virus were to gain momentum again.

#### **Employment**

#### 30 Percent of Pandemic Job Losses Recovered

Houston added over 106,600 jobs from April to July, recovering 30 percent of the jobs lost between February and April (Chart 2). The largest gains were in leisure and hospitality, which added back 63,400 jobs—48 percent of jobs lost to the pandemic—even though bars were again shut down in late June to control the increased spread of COVID-19. Education and health services added 27,800 jobs (led by ambulatory health care). Trade, transportation and utilities (led by retail) rounded out the sectors adding back the most jobs. The mining sector saw further payroll declines in the months after April.

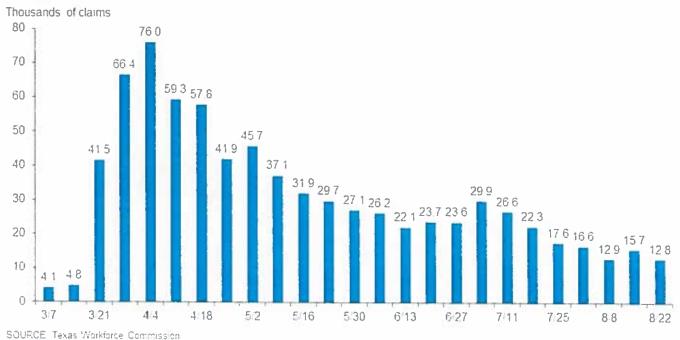
Payroll surveys are subject to <u>multiple revisions</u> over the year, so the details and magnitude of recent employment numbers may change substantially. However, numerous indicators suggest that the region did see substantial improvement from April to July.

The unemployment rate in Houston fell to 8.4 percent in July, compared with 8.0 percent for Texas and 10.2 percent for the U.S.

#### Initial Claims Still Trending Down

Weekly initial unemployment claims ticked down by nearly 3,000 to 12,800 in late August, an extension of the downward trend that began in April (Chart 3). That trend was briefly interrupted in early July when limitations on bars were reinstated amid a sharp rise in COVID-19 cases, hospitalizations and deaths. Since that time, the week-to-week declines appear to be narrowing.

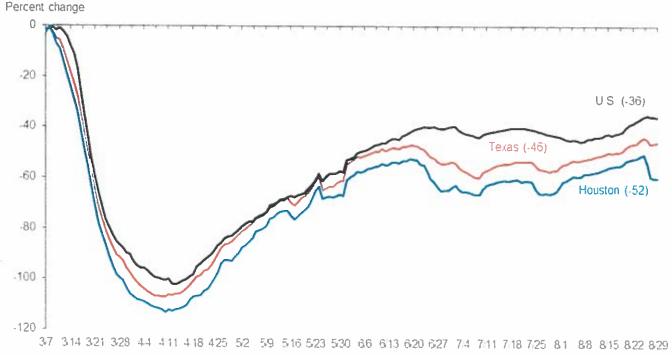
Chart 3 Initial Claims for Unemployment Insurance



#### Mobility and Engagement Indexes

Mobility and Engagement Indexes (MEIs), particularly for Houston and Texas, dipped in July before slowly climbing back toward mid-June levels by the end of the summer (Chart 4). The weakening was associated with worsening statistics for COVID-19 and the reimposition of some restrictions to combat the virus. MEIs have been highly correlated with a number of economic outcomes during the pandemic. The partial recovery of these indexes over the summer likely means that economic recovery in Houston is regaining momentum. However, it is not clear to what extent increases in the index may be due to end-of-summer seasonal trends.

The Houston MEI declined sharply in the final week of August—similar to mobility in Louisiana—in contrast with most of Texas. This is most likely due to Hurricane Laura, which made landfall as a Category 4 hurricane near the Texas and Louisiana border but affected coastal counties from Galveston to New Orleans.

#### Manufacturing Indexes and Jobs

#### Manufacturing Output Increasing

Changes in manufacturing production tend to lead manufacturing job growth, particularly at turning points in the economy. Houston production can be gauged by combining production indexes from the <u>Texas Manufacturing Outlook Survey</u> and the Houston Purchasing Managers Index (PMI). The combined index had a positive value of 7.7 for July, indicating that manufacturing output had increased modestly for the second month in a row after sharply declining for three months (Chart 5). This implies that manufacturing employment growth is also likely to increase over the next few months after dropping an annualized 2.9 percent over the three months ending in July.

Manufacturing Jobs and Production Index



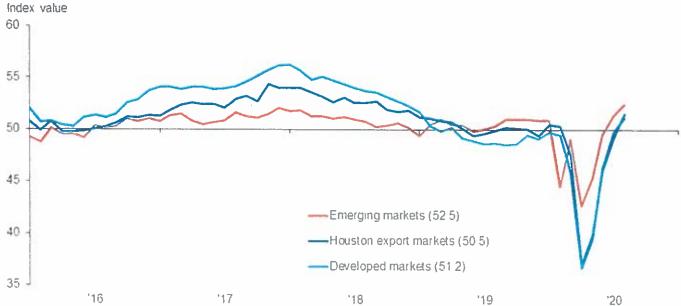

#### Global Manufacturing Bodes Well for Houston Exports

Houston exports many intermediate goods such as plastics, machine parts, electronic components and energy that feed into manufacturing supply chains around the world. The aggregate PMI for emerging economies from IHS Markit reached 52.5 in August, signifying that manufacturing activity in places like China or Brazil had begun to grow again in aggregate (values above 50 indicate growth) (Chart 6). Developed economies climbed to 51.2, meaning that manufacturing had likely bottomed out by July and had begun to grow again.

That improvement is consistent with the export-weighted global PMI for the Houston-Galveston customs district, which rose from a low of 37 in April to 50.5 in August. This implies that declines in manufacturing activity in Houston export markets have slowed but have not yet returned to aggregate growth.

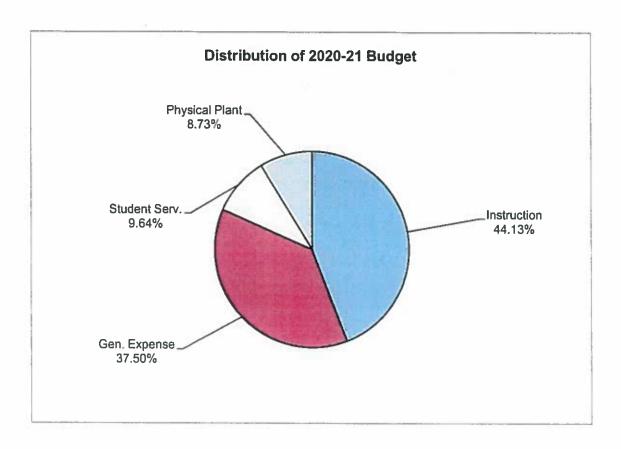
