What exactly is it that we do?

<u>Diagnostic Ultrasound</u> – The use of sound waves to see inside the body for the purpose of diagnosing disease.

<u>Sonography</u> - Using the reflections of high-frequency sound waves to construct an image of a body organ (a sonogram).

By beaming high-frequency sound waves into the body, sonographers and physicians can translate the "echoes" that bounce off body tissues and organs into "sound you can see," colorful, visual images that provide valuable medical information. Heart disease, stroke, abnormalities in the abdomen or reproductive system, and more - all exhibit telltale signs that ultrasound can help to detect. 1998 markedthe 50th anniversary of diagnostic ultrasound.








Echo with color






Vascular Ultrasound






Pediatric Echocardiogram







How to join the program





Pre-Requisites

- In high school, take as many dual credit classes as you can. This saves time and money.
- English, Algebra (MATH CORE), Physics (college, applied, SCIT 1420 or CTEC 1401), Anatomy and Physiology I and II
- Take the USA Ultrasound student assessment exam





USA EXAM

- The USA exam is designed to identify strong candidates for Sonography programs
- It will test things like visual acuity, spatial recognition, hand-eye coordination, problem solving, critical thinking, and ethical awareness.
- It is not timed but allow 2-4 hours to take it
- It is FUN so enjoy the test!

Must APPLY and be Accepted

- Applicants must apply to the DCVS program
 - See official Information and Application packet
- And apply to Alvin Community College
 - Go online to <u>www.alvincollege.edu</u> to apply to ACC





AAS

- Apply by Feb 15th of every year
- Orientation in April
- Starts in June

ATC

- Apply by October 15th
- Orientation in December
- Starts in January

 - Helps you determine which specialty to apply for
 - Helps meet ADA requirements so you know what the physical and mental job requirements are. Review Technical Standards for details
 - Dress is professional casual

ATC Requirements

- ATC deadline is October 15th each year.
- Applicants must be in a patient care based allied health profession with minimum of AAS or higher to qualify.
- Must have a current professional credential or licensure in the US such as RN, RRT, RT-R, RDMS (AB, OB, etc),
- ALL ATC candidates will take the USA exam



Immunizations

- Must be COMPLETE to apply
- Hep B
 - Dates, series, 3 injections, spacing
 - Positive Titer (those immunizes as babies are not Hep B positive into adulthood and boosters may be needed if the Hep B titer is negative)
- Varicella history of disease is NOT accepted. All doses or positive titer is required
- MMR history of disease is NOT accepted. All doses or positive titer is required.
- TDaP within the last 10 years and since the age of 18
 - Pertussis is required (TD only is not accepted)

• ONLY AHA Healthcare Provider CPR is accepted

Program Size

- AAS (Starts in Summer)
 - Adult Echo 10
 - Vascular 10
 - Pedi Echo 6-7
- ATC (Join the AAS, starts in Spring)
 - Minimum #'s (More may be accepted depending on current freshmen class size)
 - Adult Echo 5
 - Vascular 5
 - Pedi Echo 1-2





Once Accepted

- Acceptance is competitive based on USA rank, GPA in pre-reqs, especially A&P as well as reference letters and professional qualities.
- Those accepted are required to
 - Complete a mandatory criminal background check, drug screen, and physical exam
 - Attend mandatory new student orientation for the DCVS program

 - eligible for professional society scholarships, travel grants and reimbursement for registry exams
 - eligible to take the SPI exam after the first year and the Specialty exam PRIOR to graduation
- Accreditation is the standard for Sonography Programs settle for nothing less.

- Our students are eligible to take their ARDMS physics test during the program and the specialty exam 30 days PRIOR to graduation so they can enter the workforce as a credentialed sonographer.

DCVS students, prior to rotating through our clinical affiliate sites, must complete preparatory clinical education, including coursework in:

- Anatomy and Physiology
- Physics
- HIPPA

- Ethics
- Infection Control
- Medical Terminology
- Introduction to Sonography
- Electrocardiography (EKG)

The students are prepared for a medical environment before they enter a clinical site


Salary

- Students are often hired prior to graduation while still a student.
- Student salary ranges from 22-26\$/hr.
- Once a student graduates the salary range is fron 26-30\$/hr.
- If a graduate cross trains into a second specialty their salary increases to 30-35\$/hr.
- Median Salary is \$34/hr across the country according to the SDMS.
