



Student Right-to-Know Act Graduation Rate Report

In accordance with the Student Right-to-Know and Campus Security Act of 1990, Alvin Community College is pleased to share with you the following information on the graduation rates of our Fall 2016 cohort of full-time, first-time, degree or certificate seeking undergraduates and students who received athletic financial aid. The rates include the graduation, completion and transfer-out status of students for whom 150% (3 years) of the normal time-to-completion has elapsed.

While reviewing this information, please bear in mind:

- Graduation and transfer-out rates are based on 3 years of attendance that equates to 150% of our longest program.
- As the College's mission does not include providing substantial preparation for students to enroll in another eligible institution without completing or graduating we have elected to not provide transfer out rates.
- Graduation (and transfer-out) rates do not include students who left the school to serve in the armed forces, on official church missions, or in the foreign service of the federal government. Students who died or were totally and permanently disabled are also excluded.
