



Student Right-to-Know Act Graduation Rate Report

In accordance with the Student Right-to-Know and Campus Security Act of 1990, Alvin College is pleased to share with you the following information on the graduation rates of our Fall 2019 cohort of full-time, first-time degree or certificate seeking undergraduates and students who received athletic financial aid. The rates include graduation, completion and transfer-out status of students for whom 150% (3 years for an Associate) of normal time-to-completion has elapsed.

While reviewing the following information, please bear in mind:

- As above, graduation rates are computed from a first time, full-time, degree seeking cohort.
- Graduation and transfer-out rates are based on 3 years of attendance that equates to 150% of our associate program.
- As the College's mission does not include providing substantial preparation for students to enroll in another eligible institution without completing or graduating, we have elected to not provide transfer out rates.
- Graduation rates do not include students who left the school to serve in the armed forces, on official church missions, or in the foreign service of the federal government. Students who died or were totally and permanently disabled are also excluded.
